WHY YOU SHOULD KEEP YOUR KITTY SAFELY INSIDE YOUR HOUSE

Disease: Unfortunately, there are many feral and homeless stray cats which may carry diseases. Your cat is at risk of having disease passed on to it if it comes into contact with a diseased cat.

Parasites: Depending on where you live, your kitty might pick up fleas, ticks, ear mites, intestinal worms or ringworm. Some parasites can infect your family as well!

Cars: Cats don't understand about cars and the risk of their venturing into busy streets. They may be injured or killed by passing cars.

Cruel people: Not everyone loves your kitty like you do and may intentionally hurt your cat.

Dogs: While cats are great hunters, they can be attacked by loose dogs. As cats are little creatures, these attacks are often very serious and often fatal.

Wild Animals: Cats outdoors can be food or prey for a number of different wild animals and even hawks and owls. Some wild animals to watch for are coyotes, raccoons, foxes and even alligators (depending on where you live).

Poisons: Cats may unknowingly eat poisons such as antifreeze (which tastes good to cats) or rat or mice poison, if they catch and eat rodents which had recently eaten poison.
